



## Who we are

Community Housing Network is Franklin
County's largest and longest-standing provider
of Permanent Supportive Housing, serving
people who have experienced homelessness,
mental illness, addiction, or other traumarelated issues.

In 2019 in Franklin County:

**6,799** adults & **2,589** children experienced homelessness





For more than 30 years, CHN has developed and managed properties that range from large multi-unit buildings with 24-7 supports to independent housing all over Franklin County.

## What we do

People with mental illness and disabilities often encounter obstacles to finding and maintaining housing. They have few options to address their circumstances, recovery, and ongoing wellness. At CHN, our doors are open. We start with housing first, because once people have a safe, affordable place to stay, they can focus on what they need to heal.

25% of people experiencing homelessness are estimated to have a severe mental illness

**82%** of CHN residents

experience mental illness

Existing supportive housing options only cover 64% of the need, leaving

**985 households** with unmet needs

Once residents are stably housed, CHN offers voluntary supportive services to help them get to a place of stability, wellness, and dignity. Without supportive services to foster their recovery and ongoing well-being, many vulnerable people, especially those with chronic issues, return to homelessness. CHN has a proven record of breaking the cycle of homelessness and helping residents achieve positive outcomes.

#### Through supportive services,

CHN residents can access addiction counseling; regular healthcare and medication; benefits assistance; help obtaining food, furnishings, and transportation; and skills training and education. As a result, CHN residents sustain their physical and emotional health, maintain healthy relationships with their families and others, secure and maintain income and employment, and enjoy lives of purpose and productivity.

# How we move forward

CHN has always challenged ourselves to serve our residents and our community by solving persistent problems, growing our expertise, and enhancing our practices. Now we're launching a new initiative focused on the people who live in our Independent Housing. For this initiative to be successful, we need your support.

In 2019, CHN launched its Mainstream pilot program with 50 residents to study how reduced staff-to-resident ratios impacted resident success.

With special funding for this pilot program, we were able to significantly reduce our staff-to-resident ratio from one staff member per 208 residents, to one staff member per 25 residents.

This lower ratio enabled Mainstream participants to form authentic—and essential—relationships with their dedicated CHN teams and to receive even more personalized support.

CHN staff collaborated with each resident and their case managers to develop an individualized plan to foster mental and physical health, housing stability, community engagement, and employment.



Mainstream's lower staff ratios benefited both the residents being served and the entire community. Mainstream participants reported an improved sense of community, confirming that people who feel comfortable and welcome in their environment contribute to more engaged, connected neighborhoods.

# CHN's approach combats homelessness and saves public costs for our community.

With safe homes and supportive services to help them manage their mental and physical health, residents don't have to rely as heavily on emergency services, like shelters and hospitals, for assistance. Alleviating some of the demand for those systems then results in significant savings.

## **Mainstream participants spent**

much less time in hospitals, rehabilitation centers, and psychiatric facilities

from a group average of 3,142 days a year down to 33 days

## **Estimates indicate**

each \$1 invested in Mainstream results in \$1.38 community savings in **reduced costs for public systems** 

By investing nearly **\$1.2 million** in our new initiative,

**CHN** estimates we will

save our community \$1.6 million.

Based on the positive outcomes of the Mainstream pilot, CHN plans to integrate a lower staff-to-resident ratio for all 600+ residents in our Independent Housing. To carry out this initiative, we need support from community leaders like you, as our current funding does not stretch to cover it.

One generous donor has committed to a lead gift and to match contributions up to \$348,500. To realize these funds, CHN needs to raise the same amount.


When we reach that total, we will have the funding to hire additional staff who will provide more extensive personalized supportive services to residents in CHN's Independent Housing. We will be able to make a larger social and financial impact on our entire community.


# Will you give to CHN's matching gift campaign?
